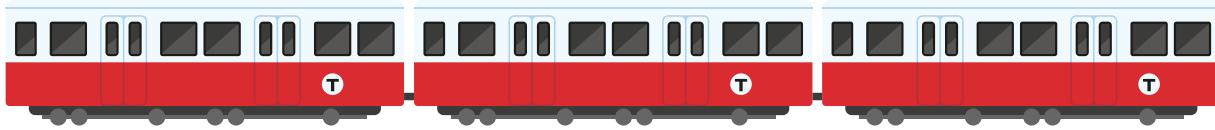


# FEBRUARY RED LINE CLOSURES IN CAMBRIDGE: WHAT TO KNOW



## Monday, February 5 to Wednesday, February 14

Shuttle buses will replace trains on parts of the Red Line for ten days while the MBTA repairs tracks to eliminate slow zones.

- From start of service to 8:45 p.m. shuttles will replace Red Line service **between Alewife and Harvard.**
- From 8:45 p.m. to close of service shuttles will replace Red Line service **between Alewife and Park Street.**

## Saturday, February 24 to Sunday, February 25

Free shuttle buses will replace Red Line trains **between Harvard and Broadway** to make improvements and inspect tunnels.

## Expect Increased Traffic and Longer Trips

Plan extra time for your trips, whether you're taking the shuttles, riding the bus, or driving.

If you can, leave room on the road for first responders, public transit, and people who must drive by:

- Taking local buses or shuttle buses
- Riding the Commuter Rail between Porter and North Station (free during shutdowns!)
- Working from home
- Biking or walking

## Future Shutdowns

When the MBTA replaces trains with shuttles for multiple weekdays in a row, they call it a "surge" closure.

In 2024, the MBTA plans four "surge closures" of the Red Line in Cambridge: in **February, July, October, and December.** The MBTA may also schedule additional, shorter closures.

## Shuttle Access

- Shuttles will be accessible to people with disabilities. Many shuttles will be low-floor and have an accessibility ramp at the front door, but some will have rear-entry lifts.
- MBTA employees and shuttle operators will provide assistance to people with disabilities.
- The MBTA will also provide accessible vans upon request. Riders can request a van by talking to station employees or using an MBTA station call box.
